FROM THE PASTOR **Why Do I Wear a Pulpit Robe?**


When I was talking with the search committee of FBC Waynesburg in early 2023, I noticed from the YouTube videos that Pastor Ed was preaching in a robe. I thought, "That's something I don't see done much anymore!" I then began praying and thinking if I wanted to do the same. I had an old second-hand robe I'd used for a wedding once, but I'd never preached in one. I'd never even considered it. All the churches I had pastored previously moved away from the practice, if they had ever done it at all.

As I gave it more prayer and thought, I really liked the idea. So, I decided to purchase a new, simple black robe that fit and that was much cooler than the old second-hand one in my closet. Notice I said, "simple black robe." What I chose to order was something that could also be called "a Genevan gown." It isn't academic because there are no doctoral bars and no hood. It's not ornate or showy. It's just plain and simple. So, in this article I'm sharing three reasons why I've chosen to wear a preaching robe.

First, a preaching robe highlights the sacred responsibility of faithfully sharing God's word. 2 Timothy 4:2 says, "Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching." My calling is not to make God's word palatable to the people, but simply to proclaim it. When I stand in the pulpit I'm not there on my business, but on God's business. The robe reminds others, and me, of the sacred task of proclaiming the Scriptures to the congregation. The pastor is the representative of the transcendent, almighty God. The robe is to focus attention not on the one who wears it, but on the One he serves.

Second, a preaching robe downplays contemporary trends and fashions. Hebrews 13:8 says, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." In my lifetime, I've witnessed fads with preachers come and go. There was a time when leisure suits were popular. Then it was two-piece suits, then three-piece suits. As the years passed, coat and tie often were replaced with open collars and business casual attire. Now the trend for many pastors is t-shirts, skinny jeans, and expensive athletic shoes. The highest goal in preaching, however, is not to be trendy, but timeless. It's not to be hip, but holy. It's not to be fashionable, but faithful.

Third, a preaching robe identifies with a Reformed, Protestant heritage. Some people may think that wearing a robe gives the appearance of a connection with the Roman Catholic church. On the contrary, a "Genevan gown" is associated with the theology of the Protestant Reformation. One author says,



The evidence—both written and artistic—reveals that men like John Owen, Herman Witsius and Thomas Goodwin from the seventeenth century, George Whitefield, Jonathan Edwards and Thomas Boston from the eighteenth century as well as countless others, all wore pulpit gowns whenever they led worship. It was simply the norm in Protestant congregations on the European continent, the British Isles and the Americas. Even in more modern times, men like D. Martyn Lloyd-Jones, one of the most gifted preachers of the twentieth century, wore Genevan gowns. In his famous 1969 lectures to students at Westminster Theological Seminary in Philadelphia, Lloyd-Jones exhorted those entering the ministry to wear a gown when they preached as a sign of their call to the office.

“So, pastor, do you expect me now to dress fancy when I come to church since you’re preaching in a robe?” No, not at all. But I do hope and pray that you’ll recognize the vital importance of hearing and heeding God’s word. I also hope that you’ll set your mind and heart on eternal things, not earthly things. And most of all, I hope that you’ll be grounded in sound Biblical theology, so you can speak the truth in love and mature in your walk with the Lord Jesus Christ.

Youth Praise Team

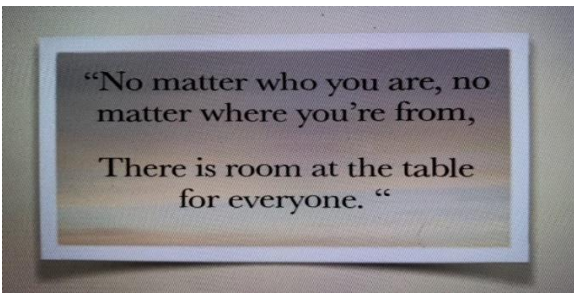
